- E. To practice and develop evaluation skills.

Hand Puppetry is presented both as a craft to be learned and as an art to be experienced.

The subject is presented through illustrated lectures, classroom demonstrations and hands-on experience.

- F. 10 hours of practical work in the Puppet Lab.
- G. Typed critiques (2 page minimum/4 page maximum, double-spaced) of two puppet productions. One *must* be from a live performance; one can be from film or video. The first critique is due at Midterm, the second is due at the Final Exam.
